(5) Supernumerary Seats for, -

(a) OCI/ PIO, Foreign Students and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries (CIWGC) Candidates. -

- (i) The Candidates having candidature as given in 5(5) and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries shall be eligible for these supernumerary seats.
- (ii) These seats shall be subject to the maximum of 15% of the Sanctioned Intake seats or as prescribed by the Appropriate Authority, from time to time. Out of 15% seats, one third shall be reserved for the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries and two third seats shall be reserved for OCI / PIO or Foreign Students candidates or as prescribed by the Appropriate Authority, from time to time.
- (iii) These seats shall be filled in by the institution on the basis of Inter-Semester Merit of candidates as given in section 8 of this brochure.
- (iv) Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Foreign Nationals/PIOs/Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries/Child or Ward of NRI shall send their applications to the designated centers notified by the Competent Authority for this purpose.

(b) Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature:

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The Candidates having candidature as given in 5(6) shall be eligible for these seats.
- (iii) The number of seats for this quota shall be as per the policy of the Government.
- (iv) candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature shall send the printed copy of online filled & submitted application form & copy of uploaded documents by hand/speed post/courier for verification & confirmation to the designated centers notified by the Competent Authority for this purpose.

(c) Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) Seats:

(I) Scheme

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The scheme shall be mandatory for all Technical Institutions offering undergraduate programs and lateral entry (Separate Division) to these programs that are approved by the All India Council for Technical Education.
- (iii) Seats up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and will be available to such courses in an Institute where a minimum of 30% of sanctioned seats in the respective courses are filled up in **respective CAP Round. For calculation of 30%, the Institutional Quota seats retained by institute for the course shall be**

considered as completely filled.

- (iv) The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the Fee Regulation Authority for unaided Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other fees except tuition fees shall be paid by the beneficiary.
- (v) The Candidates admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change Institution/course at any stage under any circumstances.
- (vi) These seats shall be available for admission to First Year of Engineering & Technology and Hotel Management & Catering Technology courses as well as in Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology (Separate Division).

(II) Eligibility

- (i) Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates are eligible for these seats
- (ii) Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates having their parent's annual income less than Rs. 8 Lakh (Rupees Eight Lakh only) from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall submit Income certificate issued by Appropriate Authority.

(III) Admissions Procedure

These seats are allotted by the Competent Authority as per inter-se merit. For this purpose, the Competent Authority shall invite applications, prepare a separate merit list for this category by following the same criteria as for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.

(d) Jammu and Kashmir Candidates and North East States:

- (i) The admission to the candidates as per *Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS) for the students belonging to Jammu and Kashmir and the scheme of Government of India of allocation of supernumerary seats in AICTE approved colleges to North Eastern States and UTs (NEUT) which lack in such facilities of technical education* shall be done by the competent authority appointed by the Central Government as per their eligibility criteria.
- (ii) The Fees shall be as that for the Non Autonomous Government Institutes.

(6) Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to **candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only** subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

(a) Reservation for Backward Class category Candidates:

The percentage of seats reserved for candidates of backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra State is as given below. The percentage of reservation is the percentages of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates, coming under the CAP. Backward class

candidates shall claim the category to which they belong to at the time of submission of application form for CAP.

(b) Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five percent (5%) seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAP shall be reserved for Children of ex- service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1), Children of active service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2), Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State, or who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

- (i) These seats are within the sanctioned intake and are available as **State Level seats**.
- (ii) A combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 and DEF3 candidates shall be prepared.
- (iii) Candidates claiming these seats shall produce additional documents in Proforma C, D and/or E as applicable.
- (iv) This provision is NOT available to the children of **CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working /who has worked in the Indian Defence Service.

(c) Reservation for Persons with Disability Candidate:

Five percent (5%) seats of total sanctioned intake of all the Institutions under CAP shall be reserved for Candidates having following minimum 40% benchmark disability.

A single merit list of all eligible candidates shall be prepared. The allotment of seats reserved for the Candidates with Disability shall be done on the basis of an inter-se merit. **These seats are available for Maharashtra domiciled candidates in HU / SL seats.**

The candidates claiming reservation under this category shall submit the certificates from the authority competent for issuing such certificate. The certificate (Pro-forma) should clearly state that the extent of disability is not less than 40% (Forty percent) and the disability is permanent in nature.

Note: -

Candidates with Disability should note that on admission to degree course they will not be given any exemptions or additional facility in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the respective Universities.

(d) Reservation for EWS Candidate: As per the provisions in Government Resolution No. रआधो-4019/प्र.क्र.31/16-अ, dated 12th February, 2019, 10% seats shall be reserved for EWS candidates. These seats shall be filled by the Competent Authority through CAP as per the policies of the Government declared from time to time. These seats shall be over & above the sanctioned intake.

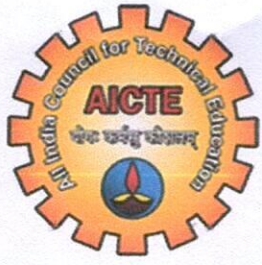
(e) Reservations for Orphan Candidates - One percent (1%) seats of CAP Seats (excluding Minority institutions, All India Seats, if any) shall be reserved for Orphan Candidates. These seats shall be filled by the Competent Authority through CAP as per Government Resolution, Women and Child Welfare Department, No. AMJ-2011/C.R. 212 / Desk 3 dated 2nd April 2018 and the policies of the Government declared from time to time.

(f) Reservation for female candidates: As per the provisions in Government Resolution No. GEC-1000/ (123/2000)/ Tech. Edu.-1, dated 17th April, 2000, 30% seats shall be reserved for female candidates. There shall be no

reservation for Female candidates under Defense, Persons with Disability and Orphan categories.

57	“State Level Fee Committee” means a Committee notified by the concerned State Government/ UT for Regulation of fee to be charged by the Technical Institutions.
58	“Supernumerary seats” includes TFW, OCI/ PIO/ Foreign Nationals/ Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries, Lateral Entry, PwD and J&K seats notified from time to time, over and above the “Approved Intake”.
59	“Technical Institution” means an Institution set up by the Government, Government aided and Self-Financing/ Trust/ Society/ Company for conducting Course(s)/ Programme(s) in the field of Technical Education, Training and Research in Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Planning, Applied Arts, Crafts and Design, Hotel Management and Catering Technology, MCA, Management, and such other Programmes and areas as notified by the Act.
60	“Trust” means a Trust registered under the Indian Trust Act, 1882 as amended from time to time or any other relevant Acts.
61	“University Department” means a Department established and maintained by the University.
62	“University” means a University defined under Clause (f) of Section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956.
63	Any other word and expression used herein and not defined but defined in the All India Council for Technical Education Act, 1987 (52 of 1987), shall have the same meaning respectively assigned to them in the said Act.



Programme in Technical Education, however Universities have an obligation or duty to conform to the standards and norms lay down by AICTE.

- 6.36** AICTE does not recognize the Programme(s)/ Course(s) in Technical Education offered through distance mode except Management, MCA and Diploma/ Degree in Travel and Tourism Programmes, with the explicit approval of AICTE.
- 6.37** Supernumerary seats (25 Nos.) are granted by the Council, for the Institutions falling under the Centrally Supported Scheme of “Upgrading existing Polytechnics to integrate Persons with Disability (PwD)” in the mainstream of Technical and Vocational Education.
- 6.38** Affidavit⁴ specified in Approval Process Handbook shall be uploaded in the Web-Portal in e-stamp paper with digital signature of the authorized signatories.
- 6.39** In case of any litigation pertaining to the penal action initiated by the Council for an Institution, for the contravention of any of the relevant Regulations, such Institution shall have to apply as per Clause 7.1.b/ 7.19 of Approval Process Handbook, as applicable in the next Academic Year in AICTE Web-Portal, in the absence of any specific court order to the contrary.

6.40 Tuition Fee Waiver scheme (TFW)

- a. Scheme shall be applicable to all approved Technical Institutions offering Diploma, Post Diploma, Under Graduate Programme(s), MCA, PGDCA, MBA Programme(s) and Lateral Entry provisions of these Programme(s).

- b. The scheme shall be mandatory for all Institutions approved by the Council.

c. **Requirements and Eligibility**

- Sons/ Daughters of parents whose annual income from all sources does not exceed ₹8.00 Lakh.
- The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the State Level Fee Committee for Self-Financing Institutions and by the Government for the Government/ Government aided Institutions. All other fees except tuition fee shall have to be paid by the beneficiary.

d. **Admission Procedure**

- Under this Scheme, up to a maximum of 5% of “Approved Intake” per Course shall be available for this admission. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature. These supernumerary seats shall be available only to such Course(s) in an Institution, where a minimum of 30% of “Approved Intake” are filled up.
- The Competent Authority to effect this admission is the State Government/ UT or its designated authority.
- In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of candidates.
- The State Admission Authority shall invite applications under this category, make a separate merit list for this category and effect admission on the basis of the merit list so generated.
- The Institutions shall publish in their Brochure and Web site the details of this scheme.
- Competent Authority for admission shall submit a separate list of the students admitted under this category to the Institution to which they are admitted for compliance.



- A letter in this respect shall be issued by the Competent Authority for admission to each beneficiary student admitted under this scheme and he/ she shall not be allowed to change the Institution/ Course under any circumstances.
- The Institutions shall also display information regarding admitted candidates in their Web site for information to the students and other stakeholders.

6.41 Supernumerary seats for J&K under Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)

- a. Scheme shall be applicable to selected approved Technical Institutions having NIRF ranking and offering Bachelor Programme(s). Diploma holders in Engineering are eligible for Lateral Entry under the provisions of these Programme(s).
- b. 2 seats per Course shall be available for these admissions with the maximum of 10 seats per Institution. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and shall be available to such Course(s) in an Institution.
- c. The scheme shall be mandatory for all Institutions approved by the Council subject to, the changes suggested by the Inter-Ministerial Committee of MHRD from time to time.
- d. **Eligibility**
 - All students domicile of J&K are eligible for seats under this scheme.
 - The student passed Higher Secondary Examination (12th Std.) from the schools located in J&K.
 - Sons/ Daughters of parents whose annual income from all sources does not exceed ₹8.00 Lakh.
- e. **Admission Procedure**
 - AICTE shall invite applications under this category, make a separate merit list for this category and effect admission on the basis of the merit list as generated through Counselling or otherwise as decided from time to time.
 - In the event of non-availability of students in this category, the same shall not be given to any other category of Applicants.
 - A letter in this respect shall be issued by the Competent Authority for admission to each beneficiary student admitted under this scheme and he/ she shall not be allowed to change the Institution/ Course under any circumstances without permission from AICTE.

6.42 Release of Security Deposit

6.42.1 Procedure

- a. The Trust/ Society/ Company shall upload/ submit the following documents in AICTE Web-Portal for the release of the FDR/ RTGS.
 - Application/ request letter of the Institution for FDR/ RTGS release
 - Affidavit^s with details of the Institution and Name of the Trust/ Society/ Company, FDR/ RTGS details (as per the standard format)
 - Copy of FDR to be released, in a corpus fund made by RPGF, copy (ies) of the Demand Draft (if any) submitted to AICTE for creation of RPGF/ Online payment proof for Security Deposit
